

# Secondary Education/Social Studies Education

Students seeking certification in Secondary Education: Social Studies **must** complete the requirements for **both** the major in Secondary Education: Social Studies **AND** for the content major<sup>1</sup> as specified by the College of Liberal Arts.

<sup>1</sup> Students may choose any of the following second majors (content areas): History, Political Science, Economics, Sociology or Geography and Urban Studies.

## Summary of Requirements

### University Requirements

All students are required to complete the university's General Education (GenEd (<http://bulletin.temple.edu/undergraduate/general-education>)) curriculum.

All students (including transfer students) must take a minimum of two writing-intensive (WI) courses at Temple University. Writing intensive course numbers end in 96, 97 and 98.

### College Requirements

Students receive a Bachelor of Science in Education degree by meeting the following minimum College requirements:

- Completion of program requirements as detailed on the academic plan.
- Earn a "C-" or above in all required Education Courses.
- Earn a "C-" or above in all required University General Education Courses.
- Students in Secondary Education must maintain a 3.0 cumulative GPA and a 2.0 GPA in their second program (major) courses.
